Pre-Interview Checklist

Complete this checklist the evening before your interview. Every item must be confirmed.

Type D Visa

Non-EU Students

1 REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- Valid passport
Expiry date at least 3 months beyond visa end date
- Visa application form
Signed and completed — check for errors
- University admission / enrollment letter
Original from your Italian university
- Proof of accommodation
Covering your full study period
- Health insurance certificate
Minimum € 150 coverage for year one
- Passport-sized photographs
Correct format — confirm size with your consulate
- Any translated documents
Certified translation for non-English / non-Italian docs

2 FINANCIAL PROOF

- Last 3 months of bank statements
Must show accessible liquid funds
- Fixed deposit certificate
If applicable — confirm it counts as liquid proof
- Scholarship or grant letter
From your university or issuing authority
- Notarized sponsor affidavit
Must name the sponsor, state monthly amount, include bank details
- Sponsor's 3-month bank statements
Attach directly to the sponsor affidavit
- €900/month minimum confirmed
For a 1-year program: approx. € 10,800 total

3 ANSWER PREPARATION

- Why did you choose Italy?
Cite a specific program, faculty member, or research cluster
- Why this university?
Name a faculty specialist, ranking, or program feature
- How will you fund your studies?
Quote the €900/month figure — state exact sponsor or scholarship amount
- Will you return home after graduation?
Name a job offer, family business, or professional plan at home
- What are your career plans?
Connect your degree directly to a role or sector in your home country

4 LOGISTICS

- Consulate address confirmed
Delhi / Kolkata require in-person — confirm Mumbai's current policy
- Appointment time confirmed
Aim to arrive 20 minutes early
- Dress chosen and ironed
Formal or smart-casual — conservative and clean
- University facts memorized
Program name, duration, start date, at least one faculty name
- Originals and photocopies ready
Separate into two clearly labeled sets

5 DAY-BEFORE MENTAL PREP

- Read your application once**
Refresh your memory — no surprises in the room
- Rehearse 5 model answers out loud**
Not in your head — speak them at interview pace
- Sleep at least 7 hours**
Fatigue affects clarity under pressure
- Plan what to say if you freeze**
Pause, breathe, say: 'Let me think about that.'

Officer tip Quote the €900/month living cost figure directly in your financial answer. Officers notice when applicants know the requirement — it signals preparation and reduces doubt.
